

2000 Winner of Annual Doug Light Award has career involving colleges, university and service to others



The winner of this year's Doug Light Award for Administrative Excellence has enjoyed a career of more than thirty years in education at both college and university settings, and has made strong contributions to his community and profession.

Dr. Terry Boyd, Chair of General Studies at Fanshawe College, has lectured and been an administrator at York University and the University of Western Ontario before becoming a professor at Fanshawe before joining administration at Fanshawe.

He has been active in many community agencies, including the Kaleidoscope Day Care in North York, the East London Day Care Centre, The Bonaventure Housing Co-op, the East London United Church Outreach Cluster, Changing Ways (London) Inc. the Aids Committee of London; and UWO's Centre for Research on Violence Against Women and Children.

Dr. Boyd has served on the executive of the Ontario Administrative Staff Association since 1995, and was elected president for the 1998-99 term and re-elected by acclamation for the 1990-2000 term.

OCASA was formed in 1995 as a professional organization to advance the interests of college administrators. OCASA sponsors the annual Doug Light Award for Administrative Excellence, recognizing the efforts of administrators in the areas of leadership, contribution to others and excellence of performance. The OCASA Doug Light Award for Administrative Excellence is named after Doug Light, who served the college system in several capacities over 26 years. He had been president of both Centennial College and George Brown College. He had been supportive during the formative years of the Administrative Staff Association.
