

Grant Meadwell to be honoured by peers with OCASA Volunteer Recognition Award



An administrator who served eight years as the Fleming College OCASA rep will be honoured by his peers at the OCASA 2014 Leaders & Innovators Conference, June 23.

Grant Meadwell, Director, Counselling and Learning Support Services at Fleming, served eight years as a provincial OCASA representative, and built the Fleming Administrative Staff Association to the point where it involved 70% of administrative staff.

Provincially, he served on several OCASA provincial committees. At Fleming, he has liaised with student councils, service leaders, and was a strong force in support of the building of a dual soccer field.

Before coming to Fleming, Grant served with the RCMP and at one time was a member of the nationally known RCMP Musical Ride. He joined the college system first at Fanshawe as a counsellor.

The OCASA Volunteer Recognition Award honours administrators within an Ontario college who have made a significant contribution to the work of OCASA at the local, regional and/or provincial level, volunteered time and energy without expectation for compensation, and have represented OCASA's mandate, and have the support of OCASA peers.
