## **Course Outline**

### Overview:

This introductory course will allow participants to acquire a sound understanding of the key principles behind strategic and business planning in organizations. Set in the context of the Ontario colleges planning framework and anchored in common theoretical models, learners will have an opportunity to apply their knowledge to examine and analyse a strategic plan in order to revise and / or create a business plan fully aligned with an existing strategy and at an operational level appropriate to the learner (personal, team, departmental, institutional).

# Module 1: Understanding the college planning framework

- Explore, discuss best practices and common theoretical models for strategy and business planning
- Explain the college planning framework: governance, legislative requirements, stakeholder management

## Module 2: Components of a Strategic and Business Plan (Knowledge and Analysis)

- Identify the components of a strategic and a business plan
- Differentiate between strategy and business operations
- Explain the purpose, use and inter-connections between the two types of plans
- Select, examine and assess an existing strategic plan

## Module 3: Creating a Business Plan

- Select an appropriate / relevant area for business planning
- Create components of the plan through a needs analysis
- Assemble business plan
- Assess other business plans and provide feedback
