## **Finance for Non-Financial Managers**

Overview

Managers do not need to know every aspect of finance nor do they need accounting expertise. However, College departmental managers do need basic finance training to understand the source of College revenues, how expenses are treated, how to cost out College programs, and the implication of student enrolment increases and decreases.

Managers also need to understand how to effectively prepare departmental budgets and manage those budgets.

This 30 hour course covers 6 major topics:

- Accounting terms and financial concepts overview
- College Revenues—different types and calculating the operating grant
- College Expenses—controllable versus non-controllable and understanding the basics of program costing
- Capital Assets & Equipment—how capital assets are accounted for; depreciation and a business case model for acquiring capital assets
- Balance Sheet—understanding the College Balance Sheet
- Budgeting & Reports—creating a department budget & managing the department budget
